Deborah Linares, PhD, MA

Dr. Deborah Linares focuses on promoting research to understand behavioral and interpersonal factors contributing to resilience and susceptibility to adverse health conditions among disadvantaged and underserved populations. She provides expertise in conducting minority health and health disparities research in the areas of behavioral health, women's health, child development, healthy aging, eHealth, and cancer control.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER PRESENTATION



William Southerland, PhD

Professor, Department of Biochemistry, Director, Center for Computational Biology & Bioinformatics, Interim Director, Center for Applied Data Science and Analytics Principal Investigator, Howard University RCMI Howard University

Dr. William Southerland attended North Carolina State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in chemistry and subsequently earned the PhD in Biochemistry from Duke University.

Dr. William's research interests include utilization of data science principles to better understand the differing chronic disease burdens among different ethnic groups in the Washington, DC area. His interests also include investigating the association between allele frequencies and chronic disease expression among different ethnic groups. Earlier interests include using molecular dynamics approaches to investigate the rules of recognition and binding between small molecule ligands and their macromolecular targets. This work focuses on analysis of how time-dependent conformational changes influences binding quality between ligand and target molecules. This approach has been used to study interaction mechanisms of small molecules with both proteins and DNA and it has important implications for the design of therapeutic agents. Additional interests have included the design of proteins with increased thermal stability for application to industrial, environmental, and diagnostic arenas.
